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Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

Policy Statement

This statement is made pursuant to s.54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps that Smart Platform Rentals Ltd has taken and is continuing to take to ensure that modern slavery or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain.

Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labor. Smart Platforms has zero tolerance approach to any form of modern slavery. We are committed to acting ethically and integrity and transparency in all business dealings and to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of modern slavery taking place within the business or our supply chain.

Our High-Risk Areas

Smart Platform Rentals Ltd has not identified any areas of high risk as our recruitment policy identifies the eligibility of the individual to legally work in the U.K

Our Policies

We operate a number of internal policies that we are conducting business in an ethical and transparent manner. These include:

- 1. Anti-slavery Policy. This policy sets out the organizations stance on modern slavery.
- 2. Recruitment policy. We operate a robust recruitment policy, including conducting eligibility to work in the U.K checks for all employees to safeguard against human trafficking or individuals being forced to work against their will.
- 3. Whistleblowing policy. We operate a whistleblowing policy so that all employees know that they can raise concerns about how colleagues are being treated, or practices within our business or supply chain, without fear of reprisals.
- 4. Code of business conduct. This code explains the manner in which we behave as an organization and how we expect our employees and suppliers to act.

Our Suppliers

Smart Platform Rentals Ltd operates a supplier policy and maintains a preferred supplier list. We conduct due diligence on all suppliers before allowing them to become a preferred supplier. This due diligence includes online search to ensure that particular organization has never been convicted of offenses relating to modern slavery and, where appropriate, on-site audits which include a review of working conditions. Our anti-slavery policy forms part of

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our contract with all suppliers and they are required to confirm that no part of their business operations contradicts this policy.

In addition to the above, as part of our contract with suppliers, we require that they confirm to us that:

- 1. They have taken steps to eradicate modern slavery within their business
- 2. They hold their own suppliers to account over modern slavery
- 3. (For UK based suppliers) they pay their employees at least the national minimum wage/national living wage (as appropriate)
- 4. We may terminate the contract at any time should any instances of modern slavery come to light.

Training

We regularly conduct training for our procurement/buying teams so that they understand the signs of modern slavery and what to do if they suspect that it is taking place within our supply chain.

Our Performance Indicators

We will know the effectiveness of the steps that we are taking to ensure that slavery and/or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain if:

• No reports are received from employees, the public, or law enforcement agencies to indicate that modern slavery practices have been identified.
